



Pool and Park Fund

One of the funds at CCCIF is the Pool and Park Fund. The CCCIF board decided that installing a basketball court at Reed's Park would be a great use of such funds. We love driving by and watching people enjoy this great addition to our community. This is another example of working with the City Parks and Rec Department to meet some of their goals for our city parks.



Donor Advised Funds

A donor advised fund at the Clay Center Community Improvement Foundation is easy to establish and enables donors to simplify and consolidate their charitable giving while remaining actively involved in recommending grants to nonprofit organizations. Donor advised funds also provide an excellent way to build a tradition of charitable giving in a family. Many donors choose to involve their children or grandchildren as advisors during their lifetime, or to involve them as successor advisors after they are no longer actively involved with the fund.

Donors may recommend grants to any 501(c)(3) public charity in the United States. Our foundation performs due diligence to make sure grants are given to organizations that meet current 501(c)(3) IRS requirements. Our Executive Board of Directors is legally responsible for approving all grants and ensuring that grants are administered in accordance with IRS regulations. We take care of all the administrative details, so that our donors may focus on charitable giving!

Grants feature the fund name on the check, so the charity clearly understands that the grant was made possible through the recommendation of the donor, unless the donor wishes that the grant be made anonymously.

GIFT OF GRAIN

Your crops are your livelihood, your life. You prepare, you plant, you nurture and it grows. That's what we do with the charitable gifts entrusted to the community foundation and we invite you to grow the future of our community with us.

Donating a gift of grain to the community foundation is a simple way to make a lasting difference. The value of the grain can be used to start an endowed fund in the name of your family, for a specific nonprofit organization important to you or support the overall charitable causes in the area. No matter what type of endowment fund you choose to establish or support, you can be sure that your gift of grain is growing the future of the local area

By giving grain to the Clay Center Community Improvement Foundation, you avoid including the sale of the grain in your farm income, but you still deduct

the cost of growing the crops, which typically results in saving on your taxes. You can find the form at all of our local elevators, or on our website and it allows you to choose which fund of the foundation you would like to support.













Farmer completes the Community Foundation Gift of Grain Notification Form. Farmer then delivers agricultural commodity to the elevator or bin.

Farmer asks elevator to transfer X bushels of grain to the account of the Community Foundation. The Community
Foundation receives
warehouse
receipt and pays any
subsequent
ownership costs
such as storage, etc.

The Community
Foundation authorizes
sale of the commodity,
collects proceeds, and
deposits income into
the charitable fund as
designated by the
farmer.

Farmer saves money on taxes. Gift allows avoiding counting sale as income and paying self-employment tax, while production costs may still be deductible.
